Strategic Corridor Penally to Saundersfoot

Location: Penally, Tenby & Saundersfoot

Penally to Tenby SUP

- The proposal will connect the outlying village of Penally with the service centre of Tenby and to the NCN running inland to St Florence and the west.
- Penally is a satellite settlement to Tenby with a residential population of 1,700 and the location of many caravan parks catering for a large visiting population.
- The link would serve the leisure centre sited between the two settlements and Greenhill Secondary school and the Rugby Club and Football Club off Clicketts Lane.
- The link also connects directly to the other routes being developed with Active Travel finance which link to the railway station and medical facilities in Tenby.

Slippery Back Tenby

- The Slippery Back scheme is part of a wider project that will connect Pentlepoir train station to Penally through an active travel route.
- The aim of the project is to reduce private vehicles entering the area and giving residents and tourists an alternative route of travel by walking or cycling.
- Pembrokeshire County Council have currently identified four routes which will be shown in a public consultation later this year.

Stammers Road

- The Stammers Road scheme to be delivered in 2024-25 will provide a continuous Shared Use Path route for pedestrians and cyclists between Saundersfoot Harbour and Stammers Road.
- This route forms Phase 2 of the overall wider scheme connecting Saundersfoot Station with Saundersfoot Harbour, and through Stammers Road to Sandy Hill/A478. The wider route (linking Saundersfoot to Tenby) forms part of SA.C.01 on the approved Active Travel Network Map routes.

Fan Road

- Fan road which is the first part of the Saundersfoot to Penally phase has now been completed Providing a link from Pentlepoir train station to Saundersfoot harbour.
- The multi-user path allows cyclists and other pedestrians to use the path in a safe manner. There was no previous path linking the station to Saundersfoot forcing people to use private motor vehicles or other forms of transport.
